
74% of New Zealand's mental health and addiction services said they wanted to **develop better knowledge and skills in cultural competency for working with Pasifika people.**\*



(0=not at all confident, 5=extremely confident)


The online workshop has given me a renewed sense of confidence when working with Pasifika peoples. The Va truly spoke to what's important."
